[REDACTED] was interviewed on January 1, 1968, concerning a letter she had previously sent to the Attorney General, Washington, D.C., indicating she had evidence concerning the death of President Kennedy.

[REDACTED] resides at [REDACTED], Bronx, New York, and is employed as a secretary for the American Jewish Congress, 15 East 84th Street, New York City.

[REDACTED] began the interview by volunteering the information that she has been a mental patient since 1947, has had a brain operation and recently was a patient at Pilgrim State Hospital, New York, a mental institution.

[REDACTED] stated she had recently read Mark Lanes' book "Rush to Judgment" and had determined that she could give a "case history" on every person mentioned in this book although she herself had never been to Dallas.

[REDACTED] was asked to explain what she meant by "case history" or to specifically point out some person to whom she was referring but she appeared unable to explain herself.

She had no evidence or information to offer concerning the death of President Kennedy.
