

# TRIAL OF SHAW SET FOR FEB. 13

## Intention of Judge Is Announced

If a Criminal District Court judge has his way the conspiracy case of Clay L. Shaw will go to trial on Feb. 13.

Judge Edward A. Haggerty Jr. Monday announced it as his intention that the trial will begin on that day.

If it does, two weeks less than one year will have elapsed since Shaw's arrest on a charge of conspiracy to murder President John F. Kennedy.

A series of legal actions has delayed the trial. The latest was a limited continuance requested by the defense.

Judge Haggerty said the only way he knows of to delay the trial is for the defense to request a change of venue.

Even if such a request is made it will not delay the trial if it is denied.

Garrison has charged that Shaw conspired with accused assassin Lee Harvey Oswald, a deceased pilot, David W. Ferrie, and Jack Ruby, to kill Kennedy.

Shaw, former managing director of the International Trade Mart, has denied the charge.
