NOTE:

Norfolk advised Henry Andrew Gourley appeared at the Norfolk Office and related that he and an associate were in a bar in Vancouver, British Columbia, prior to the assassination of President Kennedy and overheard 3 persons allegedly plotting to kill President Kennedy, Governor Wallace, and former Vice President Richard Nixon. One of the individuals was referred to as Lee Oswald.

Norfolk determined through interview with Gourley that he has previously been confined in a mental hospital in Vancouver and that doctors had considered him mentally insane. Norfolk further advised during the interview it was difficult to follow Gourley's train of thought and he became upset and started to cry. Since it appears Gourley is a mental case, the information concerning him should be incorporated into a letterhead memorandum suitable for dissemination to U. S. Secret Service and the Department.
