ASI-ASSINATION OF PRESIDENT JOIN FITZGERALD KENNEDY NOVE BER 22, 1963 DALL'S, TEXAS

Enclosed are 2 Xerox copies of a letter referred to the Bureau from U. S. Secret Service. Also enclosed are 2 true copies of a letter bearing the signature "Wilfredo Munoz" which ac companied the Secret Service communication.

Based on information furnished, Wilfredo Munoz could not be identified in Bureau files. However, Bureau files reveal the following information concerning one Wilfredo Sinforiano Diaz y Munoz, which information was furnished by INS. Diaz y Munoz has immigration number Al5 203 983; born in Cuba, 8/22/16, entered the United States at Miami, Plorida, 10/5/60. His visa to the United States was issued at Havana, Cuba, 8/17/59, and was valid till 8/16/63. Occupation in Cuba was a seaman and he claimed physical persecution because he was a seaman and he further claimed upon his last return to Cuba in September 1960, he was detained and accused of being antirevolutionary and if he returned to Cuba he would be persecuted. He surrendered himself to the Miami Office INS.

Munoz in his letter indicates he is hiding in the Hope Christian Center for fear of his life and claims he has some information about President Kennedy's death which relates to the "Mafia".

It appears Munoz may be mentally incapacitated and New York should determine the status of Munoz at the Hope Christian Center. If information is developed regarding any mental instability to preclude an interview with him, the facts pertaining to his background should be obtained.

Results of inquiry including Munoz' letter are to be incorporated into a letterhead memorandum suitable for dissemination. A copy of this same letterhead memorandum should be furnished to U. S. Secret Service in New York. Handle promptly.
