Enclosed are two Xerox copies of a letter received at the Bureau bearing the signature "Frank Shepman" dated June 8, 1968, which is self-explanatory. Also enclosed are two Xerox copies of the envelope in which this communication was transmitted to the Bureau.

For your information, an enclosure accompanied Shepman's letter which appeared to be typewritten, but barely legible which said, "The murder could have been prevented as those that were in power knew about it." This was followed by the initials which appear to be "P. S." Located directly beneath the initials was the following: "From an important witness)."

Arrange to have Frank Shepman interviewed to determine what information he has relative to the captioned subject. His letter should also be acknowledged and the results of the interview are to be incorporated into a letterhead memorandum suitable for dissemination by the Bureau. There was no record for Frank Shepman in Bureau indices.
