Oswald's Widow Files New Claim

The widow of Lee Harvey Oswald wants a Dallas federal judge to reverse his former ruiing and order the government to pay her \$95,000 for Oswald's personal property.

Mrs. Marina Oswald Porter originally sought \$500,000 for about 500 Herns seized from Oswald's apartment after President John F. Kennedy's assassination. This week Mrs. Porter's attorney, Erich F. Klein Jr., asked

the court to reverse an earlier decision and award Mrs. Porter "just compensation" for the property before it was damaged. The property was "substantially destroyed and greatly decreased in value while it was in
