On March 15, 1971, Mr. Irwin Goldbloom, General Litigation, Civil Division, Department of Justice, phoned Special Agent Whitson and stated that he was calling with regard to the tort suit brought by Marina Oswald to recover the value of certain Warren Commission exhibits. It seems that a number of documents had been chemically treated in connection with laboratory examination of Lee Harvey Oswald's belongings and were thereby badly stained.

Mr. Goldbloom stated that Marina Oswald's lawyer wanted to take depositions with regard to the examination of the documents and that a pre-trial conference was being held Wednesday the 17th in Dallas, Texas.

Mr. Goldbloom was told that he should put in writing what he wanted from the Bureau, in a letter to the Director, and the letter would be directed to that Division which could best handle the Department's request.
