On July 28, 1971, [redacted],
[redacted], Wilmington, Delaware, appeared at the
Wilmington, Delaware Resident Agency of the Federal Bureau
of Investigation (FBI), and provided the following
information.

FAMILY
She was an employee of the Central Intelligence
Agency [redacted]

In 1961, she was assigned to the Central Intelli-
gence Agency in Paris, France.

[redacted] stated that she had previously
supplied some of the following information to the Central
Intelligence Agency in a letter to the Director of the Central
Intelligence Agency in March, 1971. She stated that she has
to date only received a short letter from the Central
Intelligence Agency, and that her father had received a
telephone call from a [redacted] concerning her letter.
She related that she believes that the details of the
following to be correct, and that she had voluntarily
contacted a psychiatrist and had psychological testing
performed, which she stated had resulted in the psychiatrist
advising her that she is normal. She continued and advised
that she is disgruntled with the way that the Central
Intelligence Agency has handled the information which she
provided, and insinuated that she intended to contact
the newspapers in the near future with her information.

[REDACTED] stated that the following information began coming back to her earlier this year, and credits her lapse of memory to a drug induced amnesia administered to her on order of a Central Intelligence Agency employee,

[REDACTED] During the week of March 21, 1961, after returning from lunch, she overheard a conversation between [REDACTED] and possibly [REDACTED] all employees of the Central Intelligence Agency, which took place in the Central Intelligence Agency Office located on the second floor of [REDACTED] Paris, France. She stated that she does not recall who was talking, but that the conversation concerned the fact that the President was not doing what was good for the country, especially about Vietnam, and that he had to be done away with within the next five years. She stated that following this remark, the group noticed that she had returned, and the conversation was terminated.

[REDACTED] stated that the following Friday, she was given U. S. Army orders by [REDACTED], the personnel officer, to travel to an unrecalled Army Medical Facility in Paris for a polio inoculation. She stated that upon arriving at the Medical Facility, she was injected with some type of drug which the Medical Technician, later told her was a drug which would make her forget everything.

[REDACTED] stated that she now recalls that the technician told her that she would even forget getting the shot, and that upon returning to her office, she was questioned about the injection by [REDACTED] and she remembers that she told him that apparently she had received a polio inoculation, but did not recall at that time receiving it.

[REDACTED] stated that two weeks following this, she was telephonically contacted by [REDACTED] another employee of the Central Intelligence Agency, Paris, France, and told to come to his apartment for some emergency typing. She stated that upon arriving at [REDACTED] apartment she was met by [REDACTED] (Last name unknown, but beginning with "C"). These men began making sexual advances towards her, and she stated that she became extremely upset and begged to be allowed to go home. She was told that she could not go home in her distraught condition and was given a glass of water and told to relax. She stated that she lost consciousness for approximately ten to fifteen minutes and when she awoke she found herself in bed without clothes. She stated that she was then raped by [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. She stated that she told them that if [REDACTED] knew what was happening there would be a lot of trouble. One of them called [REDACTED] and he later appeared at the apartment and also raped her. She stated that later that evening she was taken to her apartment and put into her own bed.

[REDACTED] said that at a later date, exact time unknown, she again overheard a conversation between [REDACTED] and [REDACTED], concerning the fact that "Mr. Big" had ordered that anyone who knew of "the plans" should be killed. [REDACTED] stated during the conversation that nothing could be done about her while she was in Paris since there would be too many questions asked about her death in France.
