



E 843 Three of the four cartridge cases bear chambering marks characteristic of Oswald's rifle. The fourth lacks a chambering mark and has a dented lip.

Two of the bullets above were fired into long tubes filled with cotton. The third, according to the Commission, was fired through two people, causing seven separate wounds, and shattering two large bones. (The bullet in the middle, Cf 109, is the one purported to have done all the damage.)


Commission Exhibit 543. This
