Upon careful consideration I have concluded that the decision of Acting Director William D. Ruckelshous should be affirmed. As he pointed out, the memorandum is specifically exempted from disclosure by the seventh exemption of the Freedom of Information Act, 5 U.S.C. 552(b)(7), as an investigatory file complifed for law enforcement purposes. This memorandum was the product of an investigation by the FBI into possible violations of federal law, and its release could jeopardize that investigative process. Firthermore, this memorandum also is exempted from disclosure by the sixth exemption, 5 U.S.C. 552(b)(6) which exempts "personnel and medical files and similar files the disclosure Kff thich constitute a clearly un-warranted invesion of personal privacy."
