Dear Mr. Kelly:

I read an article in the morning paper that was rather sad. Oswald's 12 year old daughter told her classmates that her daddy was the one who had killed President Kennedy. This was the truth but perhaps not the whole truth.

I won't go into the past 6 years efforts to get someone to evaluate the enclosed theory except to say that I have written letters to men on the Warren Commission, Congressmen, Senators, Governors and Presidents and to many of the leading magazines without any reaction.

In about 6 weeks, it will have been ten years since Kennedy was killed. It took me about two weeks to set up the reenactment as shown in the pictures. If I would have been able to use a military base, a tank to move the target along at 11.2 mph, and a group of qualified marine riflemen, I could have accomplished it in two days.

In my opinion, the American people have never lost faith in the integrity of the F.B.I. Furthermore, I believe you could restore much of the confidence they have lost in the rest of the Government.

My bill at the photo studio has been rather oppressive during the last few years. So I have enclosed a self-addressed envelope in case this theory may not seem probable to you. However, let me make this offer. If you should happen to take some pictures of a similar reenactment between now and Nov. 22, 1973, I'll swap you mine for yours. Does that sound fair?
