I am writing this letter because I am very interested in an old case which was handled by both the F.B.I. and the Dallas Police Department. I hate to mention the case but it deals with the assassination of the late President John F. Kennedy. REC-105 62-109060-7102

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On November 21, 1973, I saw a movie called "Executive Action". This movie dealt with a possible conspiracy to kill President

Kennedy. I honestly believe it was a conspiracy.

Several of the following information makes me believe it was a conspiracy. #1 - In the movie I just mentioned, Lee H. Oswald's rifle was stolen before the assassination. Later, it was recovered from the 6<sup>th</sup> floor of the Texas School Books Depository. Therefore, someone else used the rifle. Is there any truth to this? #2 - Also in the movie, one of the conspirators used a rifle from the Grassy Knoll area. After he fired, he wrapped up the rifle, picked up the used shell, and placed them in a waiting car. Shortly thereafter, a couple of Dallas policemen stopped he and another man and asked what they were doing in the area. Something was said and the two of them showed the

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policemen their Secret Service badges.

Now I understand that NO "agents" were in that area at that time.

Also, these "agents" have since never been accounted for. Please explain this further to me. #3- After Oswald was arrested, he underwent a routine paraffin test. This test covered the right side of his face. Also, his left and right hands. I feel Oswald killed Officer Tippit because the tests on his left and right hands proved he had fired a revolver recently. However, the tests on the right side of his face proved false. This means he had not fired a rifle recently.

Doesn't this prove beyond a shadow of a doubt that Oswald couldn't have fired the fatal shots at President Kennedy. Please answer that for me. #4- Everyone said Oswald fired the shots from the 6<sup>th</sup> floor of the Depository. He

allegedly fired 3 shots in less than  
5 seconds. This is an impossibility.  
It couldn't have been done. Also,  
wasn't the rifle used a singl. loading  
6.5 caliber Mannlicher-Carcano  
rifle? Please give me an answer to  
that.

Please send me as much information  
as possible on the assassination.  
If an investigation into my background  
is needed before I can receive this  
information, I welcome it because  
I have absolutely nothing to hide.
