Dear Mr. White -

It was nice to be in touch with you once again. As to the old problem I will save that information until I return to Washington next February:

My wife and I had been trying to contact Miss Elizabeth Cole of New Jersey for several years as her knowledge of important John Kennedy assassination information had been divulged to me by her mother, Mrs. Alexander Cole, 1175 Park Avenue, New York City. We all did meet at this address about two months ago and here is the story freely given with the understanding that I could use the information in any manner I decide.

Miss Cole was educated in France and later enrolled at Hunter in New York. Some two weeks prior to Nov. 22, 1963 she attended a speech seminar at Rutgers U. in New Jersey representing France, wearing a "French" nurse tag. On a Saturday Evening she desired to use the pay phone in the Hall to phone her parents in New York to give a progress report and stood behind a Cuban Spanish student who was using the phone. As she waited she heard him describe in detail the plan to assassinate John Kennedy in Dallas from a 5th story next to a perfect "Patry" set up which could not be traced. The young man did not know that Miss Cole could understand Spanish also and thus spoke freely. She noted his name card and the following Monday phoned the FBI in New York City and related the story, giving her name, address, education, parents

names, addresses and background.  
She gave them her phone number and  
assumed that the FBI would check  
out the story - but to this day  
she and her parents have had  
no contact or word.

Mrs. Cole stated that a young  
Cuban was picked up in Dallas  
that November 22 and released  
as having nothing to do with the act  
and that he had the same name  
as noted by her daughter.

Mrs. Cole is a Ph.D. in genetics  
and for a hobby raises Blue Dane  
dogs. Although a Catholic, she has  
no love for any of the Kennedy  
family. She and her parents are honest  
and seek no financial gain or public  
recognition. I could find no reason  
to doubt the story related to me.
