From an analysis of the results of interviews in 12/74, of Mrs. ALEXANDER COLE and Miss ELIZABETH COLE by the New York Office, the following observations are made:

Miss ELIZABETH COLE was born 1/25/47, and therefore would have been 16 years of age at the time of her alleged telephone call to the New York Office in 11/63. She indicated she noted the Cuban student's name tag. It would appear if she actually noted the name tag and called the New York Office, she would remember the name since more than likely this would have been the only time in her life she ever called the FBI to report something. This would appear to be especially true based on her alleged high degree of intelligence. Furthermore, it is noted that she claims this Cuban student represented the foreign students from Farleigh Dickinson University. If considered feasible, the Bureau may desire to attempt to identify the foreign students from Farleigh Dickinson University who attended the seminar at Rutgers University in New Jersey, in approximately early 11/63, and thereafter, have Miss COLE review such names to identify the name of the alleged Cuban she heard making the telephone call. It would also appear that she would have seen this Cuban and a physical description of him might be helpful.

It is almost impossible, except from memory, to locate such nebulous information in the voluminous results of captioned investigation, unless a name is available for searching.
