Enclosed for the Bureau are four copies of an LIM
dated and captioned as above reflecting interview with
[redacted]

In referenced teletype, the Bureau requested the
Detroit Office to interview [redacted] at
Sycamore Street, Detroit, due to the fact that [redacted] had
contacted the Secret Service and related that he had
information about the assassinations of ROBERT KENNEDY,
JOHN F. KENNEDY, and Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING.

On 1/29/75, the subject was interviewed as revealed
in enclosed LIM. [redacted] has a severe [mental disorder] and
cannot correlate time factors. He bases information on
innocuous sightings of people walking by his house and a
love affair he had with a black female which subsequently
caused the riots in Detroit during the summer of 1967.

He does not appear to be violent, however, he has
grandiose ideas about the world centering around him.

No further investigation is being conducted by the
Detroit Division since [redacted] is obviously mentally sick.
Secret Service Agent [redacted] was advised of the
above circumstances.
