ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT
JOHN FITZGERALD KENNEDY,
NOVEMBER 22, 1963
DALLAS, TEXAS

On November 13, 1975, [redacted] Intelligence Agent, Internal Revenue Service (IRS), Ft. Worth, Texas, advised the Federal Bureau of Investigation that he, Popham, had interviewed on November 10, 1975, [redacted], who is an inmate assigned to the Ellis Unit, Huntsville State Prison, Huntsville, Texas. [redacted] was being interviewed because of an IRS matter involving another individual.

During the course of this IRS interview, [redacted] stated he was in prison and was released during 1960, serving time for Arson. Upon his release from an unnamed penitentiary, [redacted] proceeded to Irving, Texas, where he established Northside Plumbing Company. During this employment, [redacted] became associated with (First Name Unknown) Alexander, who had some "syndicate ties". [redacted] became very familiar with Alexander's activities and when Alexander died during 1963, [redacted] pursued Alexander's illegal activities, which included payoffs of various public officials.

[redacted] said he was approached by Lee Harvey Oswald during 1963 and requested [redacted] to supply two men to assist Oswald in killing President John Fitzgerald Kennedy. Oswald said he was in a position

to pay \$50,000 to each of the two men who would be supplied by [REDACTED] [REDACTED] told Oswald he wanted no part of such activities.

[REDACTED] said after President Kennedy was slain November 22, 1963, he, [REDACTED] went to the Dallas Police Department and advised some unnamed officers about the above described activities. These unnamed Dallas Police Officers advised [REDACTED] to "forget it" because such information would not add to the investigation.

IRS Agent [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] had a mental breakdown during 1967 and also has a serious speech impediment.
