SUBJECT: SENSTUDY (INVESTIGATION OF ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT JOHN F. KENNEDY) On 11/21/75 retired Bureau official James R. Malley telephonically advised that he had been earlier alerted by Mr. Paul Daly of the Office of Legal Counsel that he, Malley, would be receiving a request by the Senate Select Committee for Intelligence Activities concerning an interview with regard to Malley's involvement in the investigation into the assassination of President Kennedy. (Mr. Malley at the time was Inspector - Number One Man, General Investigative Division, and had the responsibility of liaison between the FBI and the Warren Commission.) Malley advised that he has now received a telephone call from a Mr. Wallich (phonetic) of the staff of the Senate Select Committee who stated he desired to interview Malley on Tuesday, 11/25/75, and requested that Malley advise Wallich on Monday as to a convenient time for the interview. Malley stated that Mr. Daly had earlier indicated that the Office of Legal Counsel would desire to talk with him prior to any interview of Malley by the Committee. Malley stated Daly was on leave today and he wanted to insure that the Bureau was aware of this requested interview by the Senate Select Committee. Malley was advised that Inspector Hotis would be in touch with him to make arrangements concerning this matter. Malley indicated that he would be available most any time this coming weekend or on Monday morning, 11/24/75, for consultation. RECOMMENDED ACTION That Inspector Hotis make telephonic contact with James R. Malley, telephone number concerning this matter.
