## *Assassination of Pres.*

(INTELLIGENCE) (U) DANIEL E. GILROY, CHIEF OF THE NEWLY FORMED SENATE INVESTIGATIVE COMMITTEE, SAID TODAY HE MAY TAKE UP TO SIX MONTHS BEFORE HIS PANEL WILL DECIDE WHETHER TO REOPEN THE INVESTIGATION INTO THE ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT JOHN F. KENNEDY.

GILROY HELD THE FIRST CLOSED MEETING OF THE 15-MEMBER COMMITTEE WHICH WILL TAKE OVER CIA, DIA AND DDCI'S INVESTIGATIVE POWERS -- THE OVERSIGHT AND INVESTIGATIVE FUNCTIONS OF AN EXISTING PANEL WHICH GOES OUT OF BUSINESS TOMORROW. THE 15-MEMBER WORKING GROUP OF DEMOCRATIC AND REPUBLICAN LEADERS LAST WEEK APPROVED THE NEW COMMITTEE MEMBERS AFTER ITS CHARTER WAS APPROVED BY THE FULL SENATE.

SEN. JOHN FOLEY, D-WASH., VICE CHAIRMAN OF THE OLD COMMITTEE, SAID YESTERDAY THE OVERSIGHT PANEL WOULD TURN OVER TO HIM IF HIS AGENCIES HAVE KNOWN ABOUT THE CIRCUMSTANCES OF THE 1963 KENNEDY MURDER IN DALLAS.

GILROY WAS ASKED BY REPORTERS WHEN THE COMMITTEE WILL MAKE A DECISION ON WHETHER TO REOPEN THE KENNEDY ASSASSINATION. ~~NOT RECORDED~~ POINTING TO THE 1964 COMMISSION LEFT OFF.

"OFFICIALLY", HE HAVE NOT YET RECEIVED THE REPORT. *46-JUN-8-1976* "OFFICIALLY", HE HAVE NOT YET RECEIVED THE REPORT" ~~NOT STATING~~ ~~COMMITTEE~~, GILROY STRESSING THAT HIS PANEL IS ~~NOT~~ ~~STILL~~ ~~GET ORGANIZED~~. WE ESTIMATED IT ~~WILL TAKE~~ IT TO "ABOUT SIX MONTHS" TO WORK OUT A RECOMMENDATION ON THE KENNEDY REPORT, WHICH IS EXPECTED TO BE MADE PUBLIC IN ABOUT TWO WEEKS.

"OUR PRIORITY FUNCTION AT THIS JUNCTURE IS TO ESTABLISH GUIDELINES FOR THE AGENCIES," ~~ING~~ HE SAID. "TODAY WE SUBMITTED FOR STUDY THE COMMITTEE RULES OF PROCEDURE. WE DECIDED, AS PART OF THE TRANSITION, TO RETAIN 20 STAFF MEMBERS" FROM THE OLD COMMITTEE.
