ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT
JOHN FITZGERALD KENNEDY, DALLAS, TEXAS,
NOVEMBER 22, 1963

On May 20, 1976, Mr. Chuck Green, City Editor, The Denver Post, Denver, Colorado, made available a letter and envelope received at the Denver Post on that date. The envelope was postmarked at Dallas, Texas, May 18, 1976, bearing the return address, "XYZ & Q, Dallas, Texas" and is addressed "To the editor, the Denver Post Newspaper, P. O. Box 1709, Denver, Colorado 80201". The enclosed typewritten letter was dated May 17, 1976. A copy of the envelope and the typewritten letter follows:

This document contains neither recommendations nor conclusions of the FBI. It is the property of the FBI and is loaned to your agency. It and its contents are not to be distributed outside your agency.

That Oswald turd done what he was supposed to do when he shot Connally, but he was supposed to kill him.

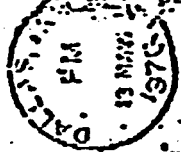

**ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT

Mr. Green had no explanation as to why the letter was sent to the Denver Post and had no information concerning its background. Green advised this letter was handled by himself and Isabelle Holmes who was assigned to the letters to the Editor Department. Upon receipt of the letter by Ms. Holmes, she immediately took it to Mr. John Rogers, the managing editor, who delivered the letter to Mr. Green.

On May 21, 1976, the foregoing described letter and envelope were forwarded to the Federal Bureau of Investigation Laboratory.

The files of the Dallas Office contain no information concerning "Independents", "E-DP", or "XYZ & Q".

Under date of June 1, 1976, the FBI Laboratory advised as follows:
