With regard to your first question, in September, 1976, the U. S. House of Representatives created a Select Committee to investigate the circumstances of the assassination of President John F. Kennedy. That committee is presently in the preliminary stages of initiating its inquiry. With respect to the remaining questions you have posed, the results of the FBI's investigation of the assassi nation of President Kennedy were accurately reported to the President's Commission on the Assassination of President Kennedy, which was headed by the late Chief Justice Earl Warren. From time to time, questions have been raised by individuals and organizations concerning various aspects of this case. These have been thoroughly considered by the FBI; and no evidence has been developed that this crime was planned or carried out by anyone other than Lee Harvey Oswald. I can assure you that the FBI was in no way involved with the assassination of President Kennedy.
