Re Bureau teletype dated 3/31/77.

Re Bureau teletype sets forth appropriate background regarding the George DeMohrenschildt aspect of this case including a summary of Miami Division's interview of "Reader's Digest" investigative reporter Edward J. Epstein and the activities of Dutch journalist Willem Oltmans.

On 4/2/77, Edward Epstein contacted [redacted]

[redacted] Central Intelligence Agency, and indicated to [redacted] that he was desirous of providing information regarding inaccurate statements made by the Dutch journalist Willem Oltmans.

[redacted] suggested to Epstein that he contact the Attorney General or the FBI regarding his observations and Epstein indicated that he would be amenable to being reinterviewed by the FBI regarding Oltmans and the DeMohrenschildt matter.

In summary, Epstein told [redacted] that DeMohrenschildt had indicated during an interview with Epstein that he, DeMohrenschildt, was drugged and manipulated by Oltmans while traveling in Belgium during March, 1977. In addition, Oltmans contacted a Soviet in Belgium, by the name of Evan Alexandrovich Denisov, who was interested in DeMohrenschildt's relationship with Lee Harvey Oswald.

New York Division is instructed to contact investigative reporter Edward J. Epstein through "Reader's Digest" editor Fulton T. Coler, or through New York telephone numbers 288-2861 or 972-6175.

Epstein is to be interviewed in detail regarding the information he provided to [REDACTED] as well as other information of value he may be in a position to provide regarding George DeMohrenschildt, Lee Harvey Oswald, Willem Oltmans, etc.

New York is requested to appropriately furnish a summary of your interview with Epstein to FBIHQ followed by a submission of the final results to Dallas for their inclusion in an investigative report.

NOTE: This involves the continuing investigation regarding recent developments in the Kennedy assassination case as it relates to the suicide of George DeMohrenschildt, an associate of Lee Harvey Oswald and a Warren Commission witness. On 4/4/77, [REDACTED] (S)

[REDACTED] contacted Deputy Assistant Director William Cregar and advised that he, [REDACTED] had been contacted (S) by investigative reporter Edward J. Epstein on [REDACTED] (S) [REDACTED] advised that Epstein had additional information to report regarding the DeMohrenschildt matter. [REDACTED] related certain (S) facts, as presented to him by Epstein, to representatives of the Congressional Inquiry Unit, however, all the information provided was secondhand in nature. [REDACTED] suggested to Epstein (S) that he contact the Attorney General or the FBI in order to make his firsthand observations known to the proper investigative agencies. Epstein indicated that he would be amenable to a reinterview by the FBI. Epstein advised [REDACTED] that he was (S) satisfied with the way he was handled by FBI Agents in Palm Beach, Florida, subsequent to the apparent suicide of George DeMohrenschildt on 3/29/77. [REDACTED] advised that Epstein (S) is currently in New York and may be contacted through the "Reader's Digest" there. This instructs New York Division to contact Epstein regarding any additional information of value he may be able to provide.
