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



However, while the FBI continues to cooperate fully with the HSCA, both of these matters, as set out in the referenced letters, remain unresolved, continue to impinge upon our investigative responsibilities, and in essence, raise the question of this Bureau's continuing criminal jurisdiction in these investigations.


As you are aware, in November, 1963, the FBI initiated an immediate investigation into the assassination of President John F. Kennedy based upon a request from President Lyndon B. Johnson to former Director John Edgar Hoover. Prior to the assassination, no Federal statute existed concerning the killing of, or assault on the President. Mr. Hoover, in testimony before the President's Commission on the Assassination of President Kennedy (Warren Commission) stated that President Johnson communicated with him within 24 hours of the assassination and requested the FBI to investigate. (Hearings before the President's Commission on the Assassination of President Kennedy, Volume 5, Page 98.)

Although the Bureau's investigative responsibilities concerning the assassination of President Kennedy would have logically ended with the termination of the Warren Commission, Director Hoover, in his testimony before the Commission, agreed with a statement by a Commission Member, Representative Gerald R. Ford, that the responsibility to conduct the investigation is not an authority with a terminal point, but an authority that goes on indefinitely. (Hearings before the President's Commission on the Assassination of President Kennedy, Volume 5, Page 100.) The FBI has continued to investigate and report to the Department any new allegations or information received concerning the assassination.



The Attorney General

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Since the time of the Kennedy and King assassinations, the FBI has continued to investigate various allegations concerning these assassinations and has furnished the results to the Department. No viable information has been developed to negate the original findings of the FBI or the subsequent conclusions of the Warren Commission or the OPR.

During the HSCA review and investigation into these assassinations, additional allegations regarding these assassinations have been received. The FBI has continued to attempt to investigate all of these additional allegations; however, the FBI has found in Several instances that the ESCA conducted independent and parallel investigations, the results of which are not available to the FBI:

No Atturber Garage

While this Bureau remains unaware that the Fal's criminal jurisdiction pertaining to these two investigations has been abrogated, the position taken by the Department of Justice, in not obtaining authority for the Fall either to gain access to the test bullets in the John F. Rennedy assassination investigation

appears to support the position of the HSCA that "primary investigative responsibility" rests with that Committee.

Therefore, in order to avoid duplication of investigative effort and the attendant problems between the FBI and the HSCA that could arise in the future, and until the jurisdiction of this bureau in these investigations is delineated by the Department, unless you advise to the contrary, the FBI will refer all allegations relating to these investigations to Mr. Robert L. Keuch, Special Counsel to The Attorney General, for departmental consideration as to whether any investigation is required of the FBI, or whether the Department desires to furnish these allegations directly to the HECA.

On July 27, 1978, at approximately 3:45 p.m. an individual identifying himself as Floyd Reeves (phonetic) telephonically contacted the Atlanta Office of the FBI and stated he was with the House Select Committee on Assassinations. advised Special Clerk Marion W. Davis that the Committee was conducting investigation into the assassination of the late President John F. Kennedy. Reeves stated he had previously interviewed Special Agent Rackleff of the Atlanta Office. He learned that date that Special Agent Rackleff was out of town and requested to speak to the Special Agent in Charge in reference to some additional information the Committee had learned from their investigation. At the time of the assassination a car was reportedly seen speeding away from scene and was bearing a Georgia license plate. Reeves was advised by Special Clerk Davis if he wished to come to the office with proper credentials an agent would talk to him. Reeves advised he would not be able to come to the office on Friday, July 28, 1978 as he was leaving town; however, he would be in on Monday, July 31, 1978. No specific time was mentioned.



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

### HOUSE SELECT COMMITTEE ON ASSASSINATIONS

On the morning of July 31, 1978, Floyd Reeves, who identified himself as a staff investigator for the House Select Committee on Assassinations (HSCA), came into the Atlanta Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) and spoke with Special Agent Edward A. Shea. Reeves exhibited a set of credentials issued by the U. S. House of Representatives, Select Committee on Assassinations, which bore his photograph.

Reeves indicated that in connection with the HSCA investigation into the assassination of President John F. Kennedy, he was handling one phase that pertained to information that had been received, that at the time of this assassination, a car reportedly was seen speeding away from the assassination scene in Dallas, Texas, which bore a Georgia license plate. Reeves wanted to know if this particular bit of information had been investigated by the FBI, either in Atlanta or Dallas; because if not, the HSCA was going to make an inquiry of their own.

It was pointed out to Reeves that all such requests had to be handled by HSCA through liaison with FBI Headquarters, but that a record of Reeves' request would be furnished to FBI Headquarters by the Atlanta FBI Office.

This seemed satisfactory to Reeves; and he indicated that if the FBI Headquarters could locate the results of such investigation, it should be sent to Chief Investigator Edward Evans of the HSCA, Washington, D.C., with the comment that it had been requested by HSCA Staff Investigator Floyd Reeves.

Of the total thirty-seven (37) fingerprint cards requested by HSCA, thirty-three (including the Armed Forces substitute card) were located and turned over to HSCA. There remain outstanding the fingerprint cards of four persons listed in the 6-29-78 HSCA letter: Robert J. Buras; Eileen G. Dineen; Frank L. Eccles; and Elizabeth K. Selleck. It has been explained to the representatives of HSCA that we have been unable to locate records for these persons on the basis of name searches and that the only conclusive way to determine whether our files contain their cards is to conduct a search on the basis of fingerprints. Mr. Morrison has advised that HSCA does not wish to ask the persons involved for their fingerprints for searching purposes. As an alternative we requested that HSCA furnish us with copies of the "No Record" responses we previously furnished HSCA since such responses include fingerprint classification information. Mr. Morrison has advised that HSCA does not have those responses in its files. As a last resort we have set appropriate stops in our files so that we will be made immediately aware if the outstanding cards are subsequently located. You will be advised if this occurs.
