CI stated he was acquainted with however, had no dealings with him except to see him on a couple of occasions.

CI said that wanted to know where he was getting the money to attend various convention meetings throughout the country. He advised them he has various ways of getting money, but this investigation concerning the union has nothing to do with his attending any meetings and, therefore, he declined further comment.

CI said that these men asked him the following questions concerning the USEA:

Why did you organize the OSEA?

Who put up the money?

Did you borrow any money?

Why did you get charters in various Southern states?

CI stated that to the best of his ability, he answered these questions in a straightforward and honest manner.

Informant related that these individuals told him that the USEA is nothing more than a front for the KKK.

Reairtel informed that captioned informant had been interviewed by two representatives of the U. S. Department of Labor concerning the financial condition of the United Southern Employees Association, Inc., the trade union of which informant is an officer. These individuals also questioned the informant as to his own financial situation and asked in particular the source of his funds to live on and to attend various convention meetings throughout the country. According to your airtel, the informant made available financial records of the union but declined to answer questions concerning his own income.

This situation raises some question as to the future security of this informant. The possibility exists that other individuals, specifically Klan members or persons active in the racial field with whom informant has frequent contact, might also become suspicious on the basis of his frequent trips to various parts of the country. In this connection it is noted the Labor Department representatives questioned informant about his contacts with and the informant was of the opinion these individuals may have interviewed previously concerning the informant. It appears such an interview could well have taken place in view of the public announcement on 12/29/60 to the effect that he had resigned his office with the Klan. Determine whether the amount of these earnings would be known to anyone aside from the officers of the union, the NLRB or the Labor Department. In other words, is this knowledge restricted enough to permit the informant to give others the impression he earns enought money through this employment to support himself and travel as he does.

In addition to furnishing the above information and information as to the informant's financial condition, advise whether it appears informant's employment with this union is providing adequate cover for his activities. Make certain he is complying with appropriate legal requirements relative to his union activities. Also furnish your opinion as to whether it would be well to curtail this informant's travels on behalf of the Bureau wherever possible in order to preclude speculation as to the source of his income.

It is noted that relet requested authority to pay captioned informant up to \$75 per week for services plus up to \$25 per week for expenses actually incurred for a period of four months effective 1/27/61. This request is not being granted. Instead you should continue paying informant on the same basis as your previous authorization, that is, up to \$50 per week for services plus up to \$15 per week for expenses actually incurred. This will be for a period of four months effective 1/27/61.

A review of Bufiles discloses there are a number of other racial informants and potential racial informants in the Bureau's service who are considerably more productive than captioned informant and who are paid far less money. It may be noted that only eight meetings were attended by this informant during the past period and of these only two were meetings of Klan organizations. From a review of relet it appears that much of the material furnished by him is not vital to any active Bureau investigation although, of course, it is of intelligence value in the racial field.

You have advised the Bureau that the only active Klan group? in your area is located at Fort Pierce, Florida, and that no such group exists in Miami where the informant operates. You must, of course, develop informant coverage in that group and you should not rely on the services of alone for information concerning racial activities in your territory. Based on the present situation in your area it appears that informant's only real value to active investigative efforts of the Bureau lies in his position with the National Ku Klux Klan, his potential in "The Hidden Hand," which is allegedly being formed in Mississippi, and his ability to pick up occasional information of value in the criminal field.

Chattanooga bombing case. Cover page "Q" contains information from two Little Rock informants relative to a National Ku Klux Klan meeting at Texarkana on 12/10-11/60. These informants report that captioned informant indicated the only way to picket a Negro was with an ax handle or club. This specific incident, of course, should not be discussed with the informant.

With respect to reairtel concerning informant's connections with the United Southern Employees Association, Inc., page two indicates informant has authority from the board of this union to use expense money for organizational purposes. He stated union records concerning money spent for such purposes more than adequately furnish cover for his trips to attend various Klan meetings on the Bureau's behalf. He also stated that he complies with appropriate legal requirements concerning his union activities. It would appear that informant's union may be reimbursing him for some expenses in connection with trips he has made and also the National Ku Klux Klan may be reimbursing informant for any expenses incurred in attending meetings of that organization.

It is noted that the actual expenses incurred by the informant on trips made by him were, in each case, in excess of the amount authorized by the Bureau. The informant has advised that since the amounts are negligible, he did not wish to be reimbursed for this additional expense above that authorized by the Bureau.

6. Type and Number of Meetings Attended, and Other Activity

While in Miami, CI attends weekly meetings every Monday night, of the Florida State Rights Party, Inc., a group dedicated to oppose integration. During this period, CI attended six of these meetings.

CI attended two meetings of the NKKK during pertinent period. The NKKK is composed of various klans throughout the southeast section of the United States.

Other meetings attended by CI were on an individual basis with various Klan leaders and individuals opposed to integration.

7. Number of Written and Oral Reports

Written reports - None; although CI furnishes no written reports, he has made available 14 letters, pamphlets, and newspapers, which were appropriately disseminated, and not included as oral reports.

8. Information Furnished of Unusual Value

Informant secures detailed information on the efforts of the various Klan leaders to consolidate under the NKKK. He provides coverage at some of these meetings at the request of other officers, where the coverage is deemed inadequate. He is now a member of this organization and firmly entrenched with the Klan leadership.

CI identified two individuals involved in the theft of \$21,000.00 worth of American Express Money Orders. This case actively being investigated by the Miami Office and no results available.

As a result of the informant's strength within the Klan and using his position with the United Southern Employees' Association (USEA), he is in a position to go to any one of several southeastern states and obtain pertinent and confidential information of value to the Bureau.

11. Stability and Reliability

He has not demonstrated or displayed any personal weaknesses, emotional instability, untrust-worthiness or unreliability. He has no domestic or personal problems that would cause embarrassment to the Bureau.

12. Indoctrination Against Disclosure

Every opportunity has been taken to properly indoctrinate this informant against making any disclosure of the relationship between him and the Bureau through any media. He is well aware of this.

13. All Necessary Action Taken on Information Furnished

Information furnished by this informant is given prompt and necessary action and dissemination by the Miami Office.

14. Miscellaneous

Informant also picks up occasional bits of criminal information. This is incidental to his work in racial field.

The settlement goes on to provide that U.S.E.A. Local #1 shall be dissolved and that all negotiation agreements with contractors and its members be cancelled. Also, that the U.S.E.A., so far as the operations complained of in Florida are concerned, be 'disestablished' which means that future organizational activities must not allow any locals to organize with employer members.

The state of the s "As a matter of law, nothing contained in this stipulation of settlement can restrain or abridge the rights of U.S.E.A. members or any other persons to organize for collective bargaining purposes. These rights are guaranteed by the National Labor Relations Act and the Supreme Court of the United States.

"Freedom of self organization persists, however, notwithstanding the order of the Board commanding the employer to disestablish the company or independent union. The order will not prevent the same employees from immediately reorganizing themselves as an independent union, even though under the same constitution and with: the same leaders, provided they do so freely, of their own choice, and are not influenced or overtly approved by the employer."

Informant goes on to say that in his opinion NLRB, Miami, is trying to expose him and the U.S.E.A. as being Communist dominated and a front for the KKK. According to informant, is doing this to aid and assist Local 349 which is in competition with U.S.E.A.

CI stated he believes 349 has "something" on the stated he believes 349 has "something" on the state of the s to make do this. Informant stated that his position with the U.S.E.A. is titled Special Assistant to the National President, which is classified as a representative and not as an officer or director of the union. His duties are to organize the U.S.E.A. in any state (a total of 9) in which the U.S.E.A. is authorized to do business.

Based on the informant's ability to readily adjust himself to any situation and the fact that his present position is the result of investigation by the NLRB and the Dept. of Labor, there is no reason why his travel on behalf of the Bureau should be curtailed. However, any office covering a meeting of the NKKK should not request CI's presence when their coverage is deemed adequate.

Reairtel states a Little Rock racial informant, who attended the National Klonkave meeting, reported that informant, in private conversation at the meeting, made the statement that he and others had recently beaten up a white man, breaking a number of ribs. The reason for the alleged beating was that the white man refused to fire his Negro employees and hire white employees. After the beating the victim allegedly complied with captioned informant's demands.

Promptly advise the Bureau as to what knowledge your office possesses concerning this alleged beating and what part, his any, played in the affair. This appears to be an incident similar to that called to your attention by reBulet and such statements are dangerous in that they could be interpreted as advocating the use of violence to deny others their constitutional rights. Advise the Bureau also as to the results of your discussion of this type of situation with the informant.

With respect to the last paragraph of Bulet dated 2/1/61, the Miami Office has been alert to the possibility that this informant may be reimbursed for expenses from his union as well as the National Ku Klux Klan (NKKK). With regards to the NKKK, CI advised that some of the Klan Officials receive a portion of their expenses for trips from their respective Klans. However, since CI represents a "Paper" Klan, the Anti-Communist Klan of Miami, there is no way for him to be reimbursed for expenses. It is noted that the finance committee for the NKKK reported no money in the treasury as of 2/12/61.

With respect to informants connection with the United Southern Employees Association, Inc., (USEA), the union has not reimbursed CI for any expenses in connection with trips he has made as a member of the NKKK. The money spent for organizational purposes of the USEA is actually spent in the South Fla. area. However, if it were ever necessary, CI could show the Klan that his expense money for Klan trips was coming from the organizational expenses of the USEA.

Miami appreciates the fact that CI does not attend many meetings on a regular basis of any particular Klan. However, CI has furnished substantial information of intelligence value in the Racial field and it would appear that this constitutes a large portion of the Bureau's activities in Racial matters.

On 1/19/61, CI was paid \$200.00 expense money and on that day departed on a trip to Jackson, Miss., concerning "The Hidden Hand". Report on this trip furnished to the Bureau by letter dated 2/14/61, captioned, "The Hidden Hand", was aka, Bufile 157-280. Prior to returning to Miami, CI was instructed to cover the "Street Walk" and meetings of the U. S. Klan, Atlanta, Ga., on 1/28/61. 
