At 2:15 PM, November 25, 1963, SAC GORDON SHANKLIN called from Dallas, Texas and advised they may have additional information concerning the use of the name HIDELL. He advised that in going through the material picked up by the Dallas Police Department, a vaccination certificate made out to LEE H. OSWALD, which looked authentic, was found. This certificate reflected a primary vaccination, type not specified, and was dated June 8, 1963 from the U. S. Department of Health, Education and Welfare Department, New Orleans, Louisiana. The certificate was signed by a rubber stamp in the name of Dr. A. J. HEDEEL. There is a little writing over the stamp which looks like "ART HINEL." The address given was Post Office Box 30018, New Orleans, Louisiana, while it is noted the address of OSWALD's Box Number is 30061, New Orleans. It was suggested that the material belonging to OSWALD be gone through thoroughly in order to determine whether a rubber printing outfit from the tencent store was found, as OSWALD may have forged this vaccination certificate.

It was also noted that the draft card in OSWALD's possession made out in the name HIDELL was a very poor forgery. There is no such number, no such register as that board, and no such number that could have been at the board anyway.

The FBI Laboratory has stated the handwriting on the order for the gun in the last name of HIDELL is OSWALD's handwriting. The order for the weapon is dated March 12, 1963, shipped March 20, 1963 from Chicago, before OSWALD ever got the vaccination on June 8, 1963.



orleans had identified a boy who was on the street distributing handbills for FPFC with OSWALD and was photographed once by a New Orleans television station. The boy was drawn into this thing when OSWALD came into an employment office where the boy was seeking information about a job, and requested if anyone was interested in making a few bucks helping him (OSWALD) pass out handbills. The boy helped OSWALD distribute these bills, noticed a policeman seemed to take interest, and then noted these were FPFC bills. The boy backed out immediately.

One of the change of address cards, mentioned in New Orleans teletype to Dallas and Bureau, dated indicated OSWALD had changed mailing address for himself and his wife and someone named HIDELL when he was manuevering boxes and cancelling out business here in New Orleans. However, people around OSWALD's residence never saw any other individual around there, and OSWALD apparently listed this name as name to be changed as far as the Post Office box was concerned.





At 2:55 PM, 12/1/63, Assistant Director WILLIAM C. SULLIVAN from Division 5, telephonically contacted the New Orleans Office and inquired as to an estimation as to when a report would be out.

I advised Mr. SULLIVAN that every bit of investigation we had conducted had been forwarded to the Dallas Office and that 25 copies of each FD-302 and each insert (v) had been forwarded for inclusion in the report.

He inquired as to whether or not we were "over the hump" in reference to the investigation.

I pointed out to him we still had a number of leads to cover, but that the majority of the crash type leads had been covered and all this information had been forwarded to Dallas.

I asked Mr. SULLIVAN if they had eliminated the necessity for further checking of the date September 18, 1963 when it was reported OSWALD was in Mexico City. He advised this had been resolved; that original source of this information had been pinned down and admitted he was lying.

I inquired of him as to what he would consider the most important phases of this investigation. He advised the source of money, motive for killing, travel to Mexico on September 26, 1963, activity in the Fair Play for Cuba, and any further correspondence with the Communist Party. Assistant Director SULLIVAN was advised that these were the objectives we understood and were obtaining all information available.

At approximately 3:45 p.m., 3/30/64, SAC HARRY G. MAYNOR, New Orleans Office, advised the following are replies to questions appearing on the list from the President's Commission to the Bureau, which replies will be submitted by that office.

By letter dated July 5, 1963, received July 11,/1963, the New York Office advised New Orleans that information had been received that one LEE H. OSWALD, P. O. Box 30061, New Orleans, Lovisiana, had been in communication with "The Worker" in New York City. New Orleans determined the above individual might be identical with one LEE HARVEY OSWALD on whom New Orleans files showed Dallas as office of origin. letter dated July 17, 1963, New Orleans directed a letter to Dallas pointing out the above possibility and advising that New Orleans would attempt to determine the residence address of the holder of P. O. Box 30061, New Orleans, Louisiana. Dallas Office by letter dated July 29, 1963 which was received at New Orleans July 31, 1963, advised that LEE HARVEY OSWALD's address was unknown at that time and requested that OSWALD's residence in New Orleans be confirmed.

Xerox copies of the above mentioned communications forwarded to Bureau by New Orleans November 26, 1963, attention Assistant Director GALE.

Your letter dated March 25, 1854, transmitted specific questions pertaining to the investigation of Lee Enroy Oswald prior to the assassination of President Beanedy and requested a reasoned response to each question.

At the outset, I wish to emphasize that the facts available to the FBI concerning Lee Enryey Osmald prior to the assessination did not suggest in any way that he was, or would be, a threat to President Eennedy; nor were they such as to require the FBI to inform the Secret Service of his presence in Ballas or his employment at the Texas School book Depository.

The Camald came was one of many thousands of investigative matters handled by the FDI. During the fiscal year ending June 20, 1888, the FDI handled 600,071 investigative ratters in the criminal, civil and socurity fields. The extent, depth and urgency of each investigation necessarily is dependent on the available facts in the case. A file concerning Cawald was opened at the time newspapers reported his defection to Thissia in 1959 for the purpose of correlating information inactuch as he was considered a possible security rich in the event he returned to this country. Then we learned in 1900 that his mother was sending him money, we interviewed her and his brother, lebert Cavald, to determine the reason. Again in 1990 investigation was conducted to determine if he was in Dritzorland as we were advised to contemplated enrolling in a college there. known hi the time of the associantion did not suggest in any way that he was a dangerous subversive; that he was violating may federal law; or that he represented a threat to the personal safety of the President. There was no basis for the FBI to keep him under commant observation. In the absence of any information abswing Cavald to be a possible threat to the President, there was no basis to inform the Secret Eurylce concerning Cavald's presence or employment in Dallas, Texas.

The answers to your specific questions are set forth in the attached uncorangement the exception of questions 22, 23 and 29 which are being furnished to you by separate communication since our answers involve classified information.

1. OUESTION: Was there any FBI interest in Oswald before the April, 1960 FBI interviews of Mrs. Marguerite Oswald and Robert Oswald? If so, what was the nature and extent of the interest? What initiated the April, 1960 questioning of Mrs. Oswald and Robert (U)

ANSWER: Yes. The FBI's first interest in Lee Harvey
Oswald arose as a result of a "Washington Capital News Service"
release datelined October 31, 1959, at Moscow which announced that
Oswald, a 20-year-old former United States Marine, advised the United
Press International during his press conference in his room at the
Metropole Hotel, Moscow, that he had applied to renounce his American
citizenship and to become a Soviet citizen for "purely political
reasons." He further appounced that he would never return to the reasons." He further announced that he would never return to the United States.

We checked our records on October 31, 1959, and determined that our files contained no information identifiable with Oswald other than a service fingerprint card showing his enlistment in the United States Marine Corps (USNC) on October 24, 1956, at Dallas, Texas. On November 2, 1959, we determined through liaison with the United States Navy Department that the files of the Office of Naval Intelligence (ONI) contained no record of Oswald. On the same date, his record at the Headquarters of the USNC disclosed that Oswald had been released to inactive duty on September 11, 1959, with obligated service until December 8, 1962. No derogatory information was contained in the USMC files concerning Oswald, and ONI advised that no action against him was contemplated in this matter. A stop was placed in the files of the Identification Division of the FBI on November 10, 1959, so as to alert us in the event he returned to the United States under a different identity and his fingerprints were received. A file concerning Oswald was prepared and, as communications were received from other United States Government agencies, those communications were placed in his file. Our basic interest was to correlate information concerning him and to evaluate him as a security risk in the event he returned, in view of the possibility of his recruitment by the Soviet intelligence services. (0)

2. <u>QUESTION</u>: At page 31 of the FBI Report on the Investigation of the Assassination of President Kennedy, it is stated that:

"An FBI investigation of Oswald had been instituted on May 31, 1962, so that the FBI would be notified of his re-entry by Immigration authorities. The purpose of this investigation was to determine if Oswald had been recruited by a Soviet intelligence of service."

What was the nature of the FBI's investigation prior to May 31, 1962? A news clipping on June 9, 1962, indicated that Oswald was on his way back to the United States and on June 12, 1962, our New York Office confirmed with the Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS) that Oswald's name was on the Advanced Manifest for the SS. "Maasdam." Our New York Office subsequently verified with INS the arrival of Oswald, his wife and daughter and determined that they were destined for 7313 Davenport Street, fort Worth, Texas. The New York Office also determined that INS Inspector Frederick J. Wiedersheim interviewed Oswald upon his Inspector Frederick J. QUESTION: Did the FBI learn of Oswald's return to Fort Worth from his sister-in-law, Mrs. Robert Oswald (who advised on June 26, 1962 that he had arrived in Fort Worth on June 14), or was this information developed independently, and if so, in what way? Was Oswald placed under surveillance upon his arrival in New York, or was the first FBI contact the interview with him on June 26, 1962?

ANSWER: INS advised our New York Office on June 22, 1962, of Oswald's destination as 7313 Davenport Street, Fort Worth, Texas. On May 18, 1962, Mrs. Robert Oswald was interviewed and she promised to advise FBI Agents at Fort Worth immediately upon the promised of Lee Harvey Oswald in Fort Worth. at Dallas reported the results of the interview of Oswald on June 26, 1962, by SAs Fain and B. Tom Carter. According to that report, Oswald exhibited an impatient and arrogant attitude and when questioned as to why he made the trip to Russia, Oswald stated he did not care to "relive the past." Oswald did agree to promptly contact the FBI should he be contacted in the future under suspicious circumstances by representatives of Soviet intelligence. SA Fain circumstances by representatives of Soviet intelligence. SA Fain described Oswald as being generally uncooperative, but said this interview developed no indications that Oswald represented any (v) potential for acts of violence.

on August 14, 1962? What was the FBI evaluation of Oswald as a result of this interview? Where was this interview held, how long did it take, and was there anything remarkable about Oswald's (U) demeanor during the course of the interview?

ANSWER: The second interview of Oswald was conducted by SAs John W. Fain and Arnold J. Brown on August 16, 1962. The results of this interview are contained in the report of SA Fain dated August 30, 1962, at Dallas. This interview was in the nature of a follow-up interview to determine Oswald's employment, to again alert him to our interest should he be recontacted by the Soviets and to further evaluate whether or not he represented a security risk to the internal security of the United States. No information was developed during that interview to indicate he constituted a potential threat to the personal safety of the President or to anyone else. This interview was conducted in secure surroundings in an else. This interview was conducted in secure surroundings in an EBI automobile in the vicinity of Oswald's residence (at that time 703 Mercedes, Fort Worth, Texas). This interview lasted from approximately 4:45 p.m. to 6 p.m. and Fain and Brown have advised that they noted nothing unusual about Oswald's demeanor during that they noted nothing unusual about Oswald's demeanor during that interview. Brown's recollection of the interview is that. Oswald seemed a little evasive but was not belligerent or antagonistic and he gave no indication of being dangerous.
