

Commission Hears Report On Dallas 'Mystery' Meet

WASHINGTON, Mar. 4 (UPI) — Mark Lane, a New York attorney, told the Warren commission today that he had heard of a mysterious meeting in Jack Ruby's Dallas night club eight days before President Kennedy was assassinated last Nov. 22.

Lane, who claims to represent Kennedy's accused assassin, Lee Harvey Oswald, said that he was informed that J.D. Tippitt, the Dallas patrolman three persons at the meeting.

The other two, he said were a New York man who placed an anti-Kennedy advertisement in a Dallas newspaper the day the President was shot there, and an unidentified third person.

Lane's testimony came at the first public hearings held by the Warren commission since it began, on orders of President Johnson to investigate the circumstances surrounding Kennedy's death, and Oswald's subsequent slaying by Ruby.

Lane challenges the theory that Oswald was guilty of Kennedy's murder.
