## Appeal Arguments For Ray Set Today

KNOXVILLE, July 14. -(AP) - The Tennessee Court of Criminal Appeals will hear arguments Tuesday on whether it should consider James Earl' Ray's appeal from his conviction in the slaying of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

Ray pleaded guilty in King's death March a and was sentenced in Memphis by Criminal Court Judge W. Preston Battle to 99 years in state prison. Battle died a few weeks later.

Ray claimed later he was pressured by his former lawyer, Percy Foreman of Houston, Texas, into entering the guilty plea - a charge Fore-man denied - and sought a new rial.

Julige Arthur C. Faqrin, who succeeded Battle in handling the case, deried Ray's motion for a say 1 in at a May 26 hearing in a lomphic.

Legal sources said it was doubtful the appellate court will rule cothe question of a new trial for Ray. The court is expected to take the matter under advicement and decide only if a nearing on the appeal issue will be set or = later date.
