Mr. NELSON BONE, Office Manager and Accountant for Patton-Tully Transportation Company, 1242 North Sceand Street, Memphis, Tennessee, was interviewed in the presence of Lt. JAMES HAMBY, Homicide Bureau, Memphis Police Department.

Mr. EONE advised that Patton-Tully Transportation Company is probably the next to the largest employer of non-union as well as union seamen in the Memphis area. He advised they do not hire too many employees but that they do have a fast turnover. He stated most of the employees voluntarily make application for employment, or they obtain their employees through Waterways Marine, Inc., located at the foot of Beale Street in Memphis, Tennessee. Mr. BONE advised a review of their firm's personal and/or payroll records fails to indicate an employee currently or during 1967 under the name of GALT, LEMEYER, WILLARD, or variations of these names.

Mr. BONE was shown a composite drawlag of an individual who identified himself as JOHN WILLARD when he purchased binoculars at the York Arms Company on April 4, 1968, and Mr. BONE advised he does not recall an individual ever working for this firm or making application for employment at this firm that resembled this composite drawing.

Mr. BONE advised that in the event he receives any information or if an individual using the name of GALT, LEMEYER, or WILLARD should make application for employment, he will immediately furnish this information to the FDI.
