He advised that he did work on April 4, 1968, at his business at 387 South Main, Memphis, but he left at about 11:00 a.m., that morning and did not return. He stated he could furnish no first-hand information of the events involving the murder of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.	
stated, however, he and _ friend who had been talking about the assassination of Dr. KING and he had suggested that the individual who killed KING was either an extremely dedicated individual who felt that he was ridding America of an undesirable or was a complete "nut." A day or two later friend.  gave a note. stated that when gave him this note he expressed the desire that his identity be protected. stated he has had this note for a few days and has been trying to decide what to do with the information contained therein. He advised that he at first thought he would give it to his priest, but when he learned Agents were interviewing his employees he decided it would be his duty to turn this information over to the FBI.	
furnished the two page note which he had received from and it was contained in a plain white envelope and reads/as follows:
