CHARLES W. MC CART / Coro Lake Cove Road, Momphis, Tennessee, was interviewed at his residence, at which time, he jurnished the following information:

IC CAIN advised that he recently had a heart attack and was confined to a local hospital. His heart attack occurred two weeks ago and he was released from the hospital on April 1, 1968. He was treated by Dr. THOMAS STERMS. Since his release from the hospital, he has been confined to his home each day.

MC/CAIN advised that on April 4, 1983, at approximately 1:00 p.m., he flow to Lexington, Mississippi, with LAM SHIPP, a land broker from Felzoni, Mississippi. He advised that he flow to Lexington in SHIPP's private airplane, leaving Memphis from the Twinkletown Lipport.

The purpose of this trip was to buy 442 acres of land. He advised that he first heard that Dr. NAMTIN LUTHER KILL, JR., was killed on television while at home. He stated that he returned to Memphis, Tennessee, the same day and was at his home at approximately 6:00 p.m. This is the only occasion during his convalescence that he has been out of Nemphis, or out of his home.

EC CAIN advised that he could furnish no information whatsoever concerning the death of Br. MARTIN LUTHER MING, CR.
