

FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION

Date April 12, 1968

Mrs. MARION CARNES, Senior Clerk, Alcohol Licensing Commission, Memphis, Tennessee, advised that all establishments in Memphis that serve alcoholic beverages must register with the Alcohol Licensing Commission. The person in charge of each of these establishments must apply for a bartender permit, and someone that has a permit must be at the establishment at all times. She stated, however, that a person who does not perform the duties of a bartender would not necessarily be registered with the Commission if there were someone else at the establishment who did have a permit.

Each application that the Commission receives is taken over to the Memphis Police Department, Bureau of Identification, on a daily basis. These names are put into the files of the Bureau of Identification regardless of whether the permits are given or denied.

The files of the Alcohol Licensing Commission were made available by Mrs. CARNES, and an inspection of these records revealed no one identical to ERIC STARVO GALT or any of his known aliases who was employed as a bartender in Memphis.
