ALBERTA WALLACE, 2365 Perry Road, Memphis, Tennessee, advised that she is the general office employee for the Crosstown Storage Company, 417 South Main Street. She was at work on April 4, 1968, but the warehouse closes at 4:30 p.m., and she went home shortly after 4:30 p.m. She did not notice anyone who appeared to be carrying a suitcase or anything which could have contained a rifle; however, she does not pay too much attention to the people on the street. She did not see a white Mustang nor did she see anything out of the ordinary.

To the best of her knowledge, all of the employees of Crosstown Storage Company left immediately after 4:30 p.m. on April 4, 1968. Other employees who were at work yesterday are:

ROBERT ACUFF, warehouseman.

J. C. LYONS, packer and wrapper.

FRED BROOKS, helper.

BRAD ACUFF owns the warehouse, but he was not there on April 4, 1968. There is no night watchman on duty at the warehouse.

Miss WALLACE said that on March 28, 1968, she and ROBERT ACUFF were on the roof of 417 South Main watching the march in Memphis on that day. They had a pair of binoculars. Two police officers came up on the roof, and questioned WALLACE and ACUFF. There had been a report from one of the police helicopters that someone was on the roof of 417 South Main, and they appeared to have a gun with them. When the police checked and found just binoculars, they said it was okay for WALLACE and ACUFF to remain on the roof.

WALLACE has not heard or seen anything that might provide any assistance in solving this case.
