Mr. B. L. REEVES 422 South Main Street, Apartment Memphis, Tennessee, furnished the following information:

He stated that he has been living in this apartment for about four or five years and that he is presently retired and at one time worked as a hotel clork. He stated that on Thursday, April 4, 1968, as best he can recall, he was in his apartment in the afternoon and recalls hearing what sounded like a gunshot. He stated that it sounded close so he came out of his apartment into the hallway to see what had happened. He stated that the landlord and landlady were already in the hall.

Mr. REEVES stated he could not be definite about the time of the shot but believes it was sometime after he had watched the 4:45 P.M. news that afternoon.

He further advised that earlier that afternoon sometime after lunch about 3:00 P.M. he happened to notice the landlady, Mrs. EREWER, talking with a male individual in the hallway just briefly and recalls getting a glimpse of the side of the individual's face as he and Mrs. BREWER went from her office, which is Apartment 2, to the corridor to the north apartments.

Mr. REEVES stated that he did not see anything unusual occur and did not hear this individual speak at all. He furnished the following description of this individual:
