At approximately 12:35 a.m., 4/9/68, Mr. HENRY BARGER telephonically contacted the Memphis Office from his home in Hubbard, Iowa. Mr. BARGER advised that he was watching the march that occurred in Memphis on 4/8/68 on TV station KRNT, Des Moines, Iowa, on the evening of 4/8/68 and added that between 10:20 p.m. and 10:25 p.m. while they were showing a picture of the march he believes he saw a man in the march who strongly resembled the artist's conception of the murderer which was done by BILL HERRING of the "Commercial Appeal," which sketch also appeared in Iowa papers.

He added that this man came into the picture from left to right and was wearing a dark overcoat and was chewing gum vigorously. He added that this was at a point where the march had stopped just about the time Mrs. KING entered the march.
