HENRY ALBERS, owner and manager, Prince's Sandwich and Coffee Shop, 12 South Park Street, advised that at approximately 1:30 P.M. this date a white male, approximately 40 years of age, Weighing approximately 145 pounds, and being approximately 5'9" tell, entered his establishment and presented Salvation Army meal ticket #4734, in the amount of 75 cents, dated April 8, 1968, to be remitted at Prince's Lunch by ALFRED KAMINSKI.

ALBERS stated that this individual did very little talking and was furnished a bowl of chili, hamburger, and two cups of coffee as his meal. He recalled that he only answered yes when asked if he had completed his first cup of coffee.

ALBERS stated that the individual had a very dark tan and seemed very nervous. He appeared to be ill but there was no indication that he had been using intoxicating beverages.

ALBERS stated that this individual was wearing a tan topcoat and was carrying a cloth AWOL type duffel bag. He said he was wearing black shoes, grey pants, and that he was not wearing a hat. He said the individual had dark blond hair that was combed straight back and was receding in the front. He does not recall whether this individual was wearing a necktie.

ALBERS advised that after this individual left his lunch room, another customer, whose name he does not recall, mentioned that this man resembled the artist's conception of the suspect in the assassination of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. that had appeared in the Mansfield News Journal. He stated that he bimself thought that this man bore a certain resemblance to the artist's drawing of the assassination suspect.
