:t 8:07 AM, 4/12/68, Mr. AUGUSTUS BRYAN PIERCE, 1334 Cardinal Drive, Nashville, Tenn., telephonically contacted the Nashville RA requesting that he be interviewed personally by Buagents concerning the above matter.

On 4/12/68, Mr. PIERCE was interviewed XXXX by SAS WILLIZM J. FILLE WD and FRANK J. HARRISHAW and furnished the following information:

He stated that at approximately 6:30 PM on Saturday, 4/6/68, an unknown white male came into his barber shop off Old Hickory Rd., wanting to use a coin phone. He stated that he sent this man to the Texaco service station around the corner. Mr. PIERCE noted at this time that the man was in a 1957 or 1958 black and white Ford with Alabama licence plates (number unknown). He was accompanied by XMXX an attractive white female who was neatly crossed and remained in the car.

After this man made his thlephone call, he came back into the barber shop and inquared as to where he might be able to purchase a man's wif. Mr. PIERCE told him that he might try the Sars-Roebuck store on Gallitan Rd. where he might find a cheaper type wig, but the men indicated that he wanted a more expensive wig. Mr. PIERCE then suggested that he might try a women's beauty shop, but pointed that probably all such shops would be closed because of the 7:00 PM curfew which was imposed in Hashville on 1/6 and 7/68. The man then indicated that he would attempt to find such a wig on Monday, 4/8/68. He then departed from the PIERCE's barber shop at about 6:50 PM. Mr. Plekce pointed out that the reason that he thought that this was unusual was because the mon definitely had a full head of heir (although he did have thinning hair) and would not noed such a vir. We also stated that the man was neatly dressed but looked as though he had not had any sleep for quite some time.
