



The crowd I won't be there any. Abernathy remarked he had never heard him make a speech like that. Why did King sign the night in a \$13.00 room and on the second floor, where there was a balcony? He was before he had been at the Ruermost at 29 a day. Everyone knows he was used to the best of everything.


Why did the men wait until five o'clock to go and get the gun? Was it because he knew King would be on that balcony between 6 & 6:15? King didn't have to go out for a "breath of air" as it was chilly that night I remember because it was also very cool at home and we had the heat on a little.

I won't sign my name as the people she talked with think I'm a nut but a few agree with me. One said she thought King meant for the man only to wound him.
