CUTLER came to the dealership earlier in the day, left a \$20.00 deposit on the car stating that he was getting the rest of the money from Denver and/or Chicago via Western Union. He asked of the car would make it to Sioux Falls, S.D. CUTLER told the salesmen that he sold encyclopedias and made about \$40,000.00 per year, also indicated he was 40 years old and has a daughter who recently graduated from college in Denver. CUTLER was dressed in an Allied Van Lines uniform.

NUTTON has been informed by his salesmen that CUTLER does not resemble the photos of ERIC STARVO GALT published in todays paper, nevertheless they feel he may have some connection with the killing of Dr. KING particularly in view of the highly unlikely story he told them.
