On 4/10/68,

Knoxville, Tennessee, telepromically contacted SA HOWARD A. McKAMEY and indicated he had some information concerning the murder of MARTIN LUTHER KING.

On the same date SA McKAMEY contacted and he provided the following information indicating that he desired that this information remain confidential.

He stated that approximately three years ago he was a member of the American Nazi Party (ANP) at Washington, D. C., and lived in the ANP barracks in that city. He stated he disassociated himself from the ANP three years ago and returned to Knoxville. While in Washington, D. C., he became acquainted with ALLEN WEICH who at that time was the national secretary or the national treasurer of the ANP in Washington, D. C., and worked full time at the ANP headquarters. He stated that WELCH at one time worked with an insurance company in Texas and that he is from either Houston or Dallas, Texas.

He stated he observed a photograph in the local newspaper indicating this individual was the murderer of KING. When he observed this photograph, ALLEN WELCH immediately came to his mind and at this time he looked through some ANP literature and obtained a photograph of WELCH which appeared in some literature he obtained just prior to his leaving Washington, D. C.

He stated that WELCH is a white male, age 32, weight 160 lbs., and has receding light brown or blonde hair, medium complexion, and 6 ft. to 6 ft. 1 in. in height. He stated that WELCH has sharp features and no visible scars or marks. He further advised that WELCH is of the emotional type and that one time in Washington, D. C., he threatened to

kill himself.
