Mr. Chuck Walker, 3903 Highway 51 South, Memphis, Tenn., telephonically contacted the Memphis Office stating that he had spoken with another agent on a number of occasions last week in regard to an individual whose actions he considered to be somewhat suspicious and who he thought might possibly be involved in the King killing.

He stated that he had previously furnished the name of a [redacted] to the FBI because [redacted] is his bookkeeper and had left town 2 or 3 days after King had been killed. When he left he took with him some books and papers belonging to Walker and Walker felt this was suspicious behavior. Walker also stated that he has been reading the newspapers and recalls that Galt had worked on the Miss. river and advised that he believes that [redacted] had operated a tow boat on the river about 3 or 4 years ago for a Frank Galiardi.

Walker also stated that he thought it was suspicious that [redacted] told him that he did not have to file his tax returns this year until June 1. Walker stated that the other agent had asked him to call back if he should hear anything further about [redacted] / Walker advised that [redacted] is back in town and that he has spoken with [redacted] who said that they had been on a short vacation.

Walker stated that he is planning to speak with [redacted] in the near future concerning his business records and that if he learns anything that would be of interest to the FBI he will promptly contact us.
