MR. LEONARD GUZZINO, OWNER OF LEONARD'S TAVERN, PATTERSON, LA., ADVISED THAT ON DATE OF DR. MARTIN LUTHER KING'S FUNERAL, AN INDIVIDUAL WATCHED THE ENTIRE FUNERAL ON TELEVISION AT HIS BAR. THIS INDIVIDUAL APPEARED VERY INTERESTED IN THE FUNERAL BUT HARDLY SPOKE DURING THE ENTIRE TIME. THIS INDIVIDUAL IS DESCRIBED AS A WHITE MALE, AGE FORTY, FIVE FEET EIGHT INCHES, ONE SEVENTYFIVE LBS., HAIR BLONDE, LONG AND THIN, RUDDY COMPLEXION, PROTRUDING TEETH, DRIVING ABOUT A SIXTYFIVE OLDS BLUE-GREEN COLOR, GA.
