On 4/19/68 W. L. RU ELL, Post Office Inspector, Kansas City Division, Kansas City, Missouri, advised that he had been the case agent of the Post Office case involving JAMES EARL RAY and WALTER TELLY RIFE. He as seed that the file is somewhat in less than desired shape and should have been destroyed previously. I from memory and the file in the office RUDDELL furnished the following information:

TERRY RIFE were arrested in Lannibal, Missouri, by the Missouri State Highway Patrol and were charged with forgery of U. S. Postal Money Orders. Investigation revealed that these money orders had been stolen in a burghary at the Kellerville, Illinois, Post Office approximately 1:30 a.m. 3/7/55. At least 66 blank postal money orders and validating stamps were stolen. 34 of these money orders had been recovered and were cashed at St. Petersburg, Thorida; Miami, Florida; Tallahassee, Florida; St. Louis, Missouri; New Orleans, Louisiana; Memphis, Tennessee; Hot Springs, Arkansas; and Kansas City, Missouri. Subjects had be in driving a 1946-47 Nash, which they traced for a 1949 incoln, Amacker Motors, 135 Northeast 38th Street, Miami, harida, on 5/14/58. Upon interview RAY and RIFE claimed to have obtained the stolen money orders from an unknown man in Quincy, Illinois.

Both subjects admitted to their guilt in a signed statement and were convicted in United States District Court. The following descriptive data was obtained through memory of RUDDEL and from the files:
