On August 29, 1967, Mrs. PAISLEY received a telephone call from a man later identified as ERIC CAIT in arguer
to a newspaper ad the PAISLEYs had run in an effort to soll
their 1966 white Mustang. GALT inquired if the car had been
sold yet and was told that it had not. He then said be voild
like to look at it and asked how to get to the PAISLEY
dence. He told Mrs. PAISLEY that he was "not familiar with
the city." She thought at the time that the callor wash
one of her teenage sons' companions who was playing a job
on her, so she asked the caller (GALT) "Do you work?"
Said "I'm a barger. I'm here looking for a job will social
security." He then explained to Mrs. PAISLEY that a barger
was a person employed on a river barge, and he was powking
on such a barge between New Orleans and either Beaphis and or

with her husband concerning the automobile. She described him as a white male, age about 32, five feet, ter inches 160 pounds, dark brown hair, neat-looking, nest dresser, quiet, result possibly a Texas accent but definitely not northern, eastern or Virginian.

Mrs. PAISLEY said she did not believe she could identify this man if she saw him again.
