

MEMORANDUM

March 6, 1969

Mr. [REDACTED] of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, called me long distance regarding Ray case. Employed in New Orleans about a year before King killed [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] His helper named Francis [REDACTED] told him King would be killed and "if you don't keep your mouth shut, you will also be killed." This said in March of 1967.

Manager of bowling alley's name is Jim (now) and manager in March of 1967 was Mr. Locus.

[REDACTED] left employment in May or first of June, 1967. Has not heard anything about this since then. Left ^{New} ~~United~~ ^{Orleans} ~~States~~ by plane and was held by police in Atlanta for four hours and then released. He does not know why, except they asked him where his whiskey was, and took him to police station.

He did have a bottle of whiskey in his coat. They gave it back and fined him \$40.00--not in court.

Is going Friday to wedding at [REDACTED] Ohio.

Francis [REDACTED] was married to a Mexican girl and had about eight children and was on dope.

He called this information to FBI in Philadelphia, and says they advised him to contact me. He wanted to tell this now because he has been living with this information on his mind and felt he should now come forward with it.
