SUBJECT: (O.O. MEMPHIS)

Reference FD-302 of [redacted] dated 4/11/68.

During the course of a neighborhood investigation in vicinity of 422 1/2 S. Main St., Memphis, Tenn., [redacted] were interviewed. [redacted] at that time was a patient at St. Joseph's Hosp. in Memphis, and by telephone expressed his desire to speak with agents of the FBI in connection with the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.

On 4/11/68 [redacted] was contacted by agents and he stated that he and a friend, [redacted] Memphis, Tenn., had been talking about the King killing and [redacted] stated that he had an idea who might have done it. [redacted] wanted to tell [redacted] about this individual who was a [redacted], and [redacted] told him to write the information on paper and he would see that it was given to the proper authority.

[redacted] furnished this information which was contained on two handwritten pages enclosed in a plain white envelope and which [redacted] stated was given to him by [redacted] [redacted] stated that he had no personal information to furnish in this matter. He also expressed the wish that his and [redacted] names not be divulged outside official channels as both of them are prominent businessmen in Memphis.

The original of the above 2-page letter has been designated for 1A exhibit and a copy of same is attached to this memorandum.

ACTION RECOMMENDED: Agent Medori will contact [redacted] and if deemed necessary will interview suspect.
