He stated that he was in Atlanta to attend the funeral of Dr. King, arriving there at 9:00 pm on Monday-April 8th. He stayed at the Holiday Inn at the airport in Atlanta. Betwee the hours of 10 and 12 midnight that night he had seen an individual on the road, at a pause where he could get a good look at him, who was wearing a red beard, not heavy, and his hair partially covered his forehaed but did not come down too far. He said this man was driving a foreign make car, light blue in color, and did not bear Georgia plates. He thought the make of the car might be a Saab, but he could not be sure. Subsequently, Mr. Bradford had seen a picture of the man being sought in the papers, and he recalled that the man he saw in Atlanta strongly remembered the picture of the suspect. Mr. Bradford had no additional information to offer.
