By EVERT CLARK Special to The New York Times ASHINGTON, April 17 -Federal Bureau of Investion issued a fugitive wart today charging Eric Star-Galt, described as a 36ar-old "loner," with conspiry in the slaying of the Rev. . Martin Luther King Jr.

Dr. King's assassin has been ught since the civil rights ader was killed by a rifle illet on the balcony of the orraine Motel in Memphis on pril 4.

The F.B.I. said Galt conpired beginning about March 9 with a man "whom he aleged to be his brother" to injure, oppress, threaten or atimidate" Dr. King. The conpiracy continued until about pril 5, the agency said.

Attorney General Ramsey Clark announced that Galt was being sought as a fugitive on he charge of having conspired o violate Dr. King's civil rights, n violation of Title 18, Section 241, of the United States Code.


The maximum penalty on conviction under this law is a \$5,000 fine and a 10-year prison sentence.
