A woman identifying herself as VIRGINIA GUY, a photographer and journalist employed with a "small news service" in town, called WFO at 11:30pm, 4/18/68, and advised as follows:

While covering the funeral of MARTIN LUTHER KING in Atlanta, Ga., she took pictures during the procession from the church to Morehouse College. Among these pictures were three of a group of people standing on an overpass above the procession. These were developed and printed during the evening of 4/18 and reveal four men standing on the overpass. It is her opinion one of these men resembles the FBI poster photo of ERIC STARVO GALT.

She showed these photographs to JERRY O'LEARY of "The Evening Star" newspaper, and O'LEARY suggested that she report the matter to the FBI. O'LEARY told her he contacted someone at the FBI during evening of 4/18, who stated a FBI representative would be in touch with her.

She is willing to exhibit the photos to the FBI. Interview arrangements can be made by calling her office: 223-4088.

After GUY called, Bureau Supervisor HUNTER E. HELGESON, Division 6, contacted WFO and said O'LEARY had contacted the Bureau re this matter. Mr. HELGESON said that STERLING B. DONAHOE in Mr. DE LOACH's office has instructed that VIRGINIA GUY be contacted by a WFO agent in the A.M. of 4/19 and arrangements be made to examine the photographs.
