His Lisbon Log

By Norman Kirkham Special to the Washington Post LONDON, June 16—A detailed dossier on the movements in Lisbon of Ramon George Sneyd, 40, who seemed during nine days there to be a quiet, lonely Canadian with little money, is being prepared for the FBI by Portuguese authorities.

Bar girls, hotel staff and agents for undercover mercenary recruiting organizations are among those who have been questioned about Sneyd, believed to be James Earl Ray, the accused killer of Dr. Martin Luther King.

According to reliable sources in Lisbon, FBI agents suspected Sneyd when he flew there from London by an afternoon flight on May 8. He is said to have been followed during the next nine days. Information officials at the American Embassy say they were not tola anything about Sneyd during his visit. He went straight from the
