Re memo, 12/5/63, from SAs JAMES W. BOOKHOUT and GEORGE W. H. CARLSON concerning information furnished by Mr. HENRY WADE, Dallas County District Attorney, with reference to an individual named LEE, who was possibly connected with ASCAP.

On 12/6/63, Mr. CHARLES F. McDOWELL, Division Manager, American Society of Composers, Authors, and Publishers (ASCAP), 1700 Tower Petroleum Building, Dallas, advised he had been manager since 1943, and no one by the name of LEE has ever been associated with his office. He stated he recalled one VINCENT LEE (Oriental descent) was formerly District Manager for AGVA (American Guild of Varieties Artists). He stated that LEE formerly worked Texas and Oklahoma for the above organization and possibly Louisiana. He stated the last time he heard from VINCENT LEE he was in El Paso about five years ago and was working as a booker of shows in Juarez, Mexico. Mr. McDO: TELL said he did not recall the middle initial of VINCENT LEE. He described VINCENT LEE as W, M, 5'9", slightly pudgy, dark hair, wore black horn-rimmed glasses, Oriental descent, and had a Caucasian wife.

On 12/6/63, Mrs. WILMA HUGHES, AGVA, Continental Bus Station Building, Dallas, advised that VINCENT MICHAEL LEE was formerly Branch Manager of AGVA approximately eight years ago. She stated she had no knowledge of LEE's

present whereabouts; however, she is of the opinion that his whereabouts may be known to the national office of AGVA at 551 5th Avenue, New York, New York. She had no further information concerning VINCENT MICHAEL LEE.

Inasmuch as it has been established that the LEE described by HENRY WADE is not identical to V. T. LEE, who is active in FPCC in New York, no additional investigation is warranted in this matter.
