

**GIRL KILLED**

**Train Sniper  
Possibility  
In Slaying**

NEW YORK (AP) — Police are investigating the possibility that a sniper aboard a passing train fired the shot that killed a young secretary as she sat at a vanity table in her furnished room Sunday night.

Glenda Unterreiner, 26, a native of St. Louis, Mo., who came to New York six weeks ago, apparently was setting her hair when the shot crashed through her closed window, which faces the Long Island Railroad tracks, about 50 feet away.

The bullet penetrated her heart. She staggered into the hallway and collapsed.

The landlady, Mrs. Ilse Norton, told police she heard a loud crack, then a scream, and found Miss Unterreiner's pajama-clad body on the floor.

Detectives are trying to determine whether the slaying was calculated or accidental.

The window blind was up and the curtain was not drawn.
